Types of Master's Degree

Professional Degrees

- MBA, MSW, MPH, etc...
 - employment or advancement within a given field

Academic Degrees

- Master of Science, Master of Arts
 - intellectual growth through research, classes and exams or a thesis
 - field specializations (e.g., structural engineering within Civil Engr)
 - sometimes prerequisites for doctoral work





Types of Ph.D. Degrees

Professional degrees (e.g., MD, JD)

 stress the practical application of knowledge and skills

Academic degree (Ph.D.)

- advances knowledge through original research in a given academic field.
- If you want to conduct research in industry, academia or government, a Ph.D. will likely be required.





Master's vs. Ph.D.

Master's Degree

- 1-3 years
- May be self-funded
- Usually course- and exam-based, or a thesis with original research.
- Prepare you for professional career in private or public sector

Master's vs. Ph.D.

Ph.D.


- 5+ years
- Often funded by university
 - employment as teaching assistant or research assistant
 - tuition paid by university
- Research-based with some classes
- Prepare you for research career in academia or high-level professional career





In general, the higher the degree, the higher the salary

Earnings and unemployment rates by educational attainment, 2022

But there are costs too!

- Tuition can be expensive
- You aren't earning as much money while in graduate school
 - low salary or no salary
- Many take out student loans that take over a decade to repay, with interest
- There is a lot of variation in graduate programs and career outcomes, so research is key!





Additional Salary vs. Costs: Example Calculation

\$5000

Monthly salary for Master's degree in Psychology (salary.com)

\$7800

Monthly salary for Ph.D. in Psychology (salary.com)

5


Extra years in graduate school to obtain Ph.D.
Assume no cost, but only \$2000/month salary

Assuming a funded Ph.D. (no tuition charges, but low salary)

You will earn more money with the Ph.D., but you will miss out of 5 years of salary using your Master's degree.



Most with PhD will earn more over time

Going back to school becomes the better financial decision after 10.8 years

Should I earn a Master's before a Ph.D.?

Benefits

- "Try before you buy"
 - Leave after 1-3 years with something tangible even if you don't decide to continue to Ph.D.
 - You may be able to earn as much with a MS as a Ph.D. in some fields.
- Ph.D. may take less time
 - Classes may transfer and some requirements may be waived (particularly at same institution as Master's)
 - You've already learned key skills-you are ready for research



Should I earn a Master's before a Ph.D.?

Liabilities

- Greater total time in grad school
 - More costs
 - More time earning less salary
- Master's plus Ph.D. may not be worth more than just a Ph.D.
 - Most employers will look just at your final degree, unless Master's is in a totally different field





Should I wait a year or more after Master's to pursue Ph.D.?

Go straight on if you really want that Ph.D.

 less time until the "break even" point in your future

If you aren't sure you want the Ph.D., probably wait

- Ph.D. is huge commitment
- dropping Ph.D. after 4 or 5 years is worst-case scenario





Master's Programs vs. Ph.D Programs

- PhD programs are generally fully funded
 - However, PhD programs are lengthier and take
 5-8 years to complete

- Master's Programs are usually self-funded, although some schools do provide some merit funding
 - Usually 1-3 years in length



Funding a Master's Program

- Get creative!
- Apply to at least a few schools to weigh your options
- Consider programs that allow you to TA or those with other Assistantship positions
- Consider Americorps or Peace Corps
- Apply to competitive scholarships and fellowships
- Select option to be considered for scholarships or meet program deadlines for fellowship consideration



Typical PhD 5-year offer letter

- PhD programs are generally fully funded
 - 5 years
 - Include tuition (including out of state)
 - Health insurance
 - Stipend for first year
 - Employment years 2-5 during AY
 - May include some fees
- May not include
 - Summer support
 - Campus fees up to \$1000 per year
- Probably doesn't include
 - Housing
 - Parking



PhD funding

Tips and Tricks

- Contact faculty and staff about fellowships
- Funding differs between programs/universities
- Use offer letter as bargaining tool



Funding a Ph.D Program

- Most PhD programs fully funded
- Apply to at least a few programs
- Funded with a variety of sources
 - scholarships, fellowships, research + teaching assistantships etc
- Apply for external funding
 - Ex: NSF GRF, SMART PROGRAM DOD,
 Fellowships with individual centers
- Ph.D's include a modest living stipend
 - Average 20-40k annually
- It is difficult if not prohibited to work elsewhere while completing your Ph.D
